John Scott Garbry Museum, 8415 Looney Road, Piqua

This includes a hands-on museum replica of a town square featuring 19th century shops and craft demonstrations. The museum highlights regionally collected artifacts and vehicles from covered wagons to horse drawn firetrucks and a restored bull cart.

Johnston Farm & Indian Agency, 9845 N. Hardin Road, Piqua

The 174 acre farm includes a home restored to the 1829 period of Federal Indian Agent Colonel John Johnston as well as a double-pen barn and a segment of the 1837 Miami & Erie Canal. During the Open Doors program the John Johnston home will be available to tour.

Piqua Masonic Temple, 217 W. High Street, Piqua

The Piqua Masonic temple was originally built by the Piqua Baptist Church as their center of worship. The building was constructed in 1848 with the worship center on the upper floor and the Sunday School on the ground floor. The building later became the home of the Piqua Masonic Lodge after World War I.

Each of these locations will be open from 1:30 – 4:30 p.m. on Sunday, September 8, 2018. There will be folks on hand to answer questions about the building and give tours.
